Background

Rigor criteria are awareness of the dimensions of spirituality through sketches, applied. Discourse analysis of the students was carried out through paintings that depict mental images, ideas, fears, and concerns that content analysis using the IRAMUTEQ software platform for are part of the spiritual competencies in nursing practice.

Objective

Explore perceptions, experiences, and discourses of nursing students providing end-of-life spiritual care. Analyze emerging spirituality dimensions and expressions during nursing education. during the nursing education process.

Methods

narrative technique employed to facilitate understanding of narratives accompanying the images of the drawings and the multidimensional analysis of texts and questionnaires, which allows for statistical analysis of the corpus of texts and/or tables of individuals/characters.

> The program enables textual analysis with qualitative algorithms based on the lexicon used, using the hierarchical descending classification described in its method by Reinert (Morales, 2019)


Results

Preliminary findings identify a number of categories which emerged from the content analysis. Mainly perceptions of the spiritual dimension and the meaning of the integration of spirituality in the care in end-of-life patients.

Spirituality is the main focus that is articulated from (1) life, as a feeling to let oneself go, sometimes with some fear, to reach the soul and hope, and (2) the representations of the person from freedom, the inner self and peace of mind.

Conclusion

Nursing students emphasize the significance of spirituality in end-of-life patient care, acknowledging its absence in the curriculum. The intrapersonal and interpersonal dimensions of spirituality are most prominent, while the transpersonal dimension is primarily linked to religious practices.
